<b>Polite</b>	<p>Set reading and math goals with students and share with parents to support student success. Provide parents with activities and resources that focus on building sight word knowledge, foundational reading skills, number sense, and number fluency.</p>	<p>Know your child's goals. Have fun with the phonics' activities, sight word books, and math resources. Use them to practice sight words, adding and subtracting quickly and accurately, decoding and blending words.</p> <p>Monitor progress by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Checking folder daily.</li> <li>-Talking with them about their day.</li> <li>-Celebrating with them when they show progress toward their goals.</li> <li>-Attending academic events at school and parent/teacher conferences.</li> </ul>	<p>Use the activities to practice with your family to learn your sight words and math facts within 10. Practice decoding unknown words and reading them fluently. Complete homework practice to help you reach your reading and math goals. Ask for help when you need it.</p>
<b>Responsible</b>	<p>Offer online support to parents of both in-person students and online students. Feature games, websites, and activities that can improve sight word and math fact fluency as well as also build phonics' skills and number sense.</p>	<p>Use online learning tools and/or suggested research-based educational practices provided by the teacher to improve sight word and math fact fluency as well as also build phonics' skills and number sense.</p>	<p>Be responsible and work hard when using online games to help you practice adding and subtracting quickly and accurately, learning sight words, and practicing phonics' strategies.</p>
<b>Obedient</b>	<p>Provide students with appropriate reading material through instructional resources, the media center, or online virtual libraries that they can take home to practice reading and building literacy skills.</p>	<p>Dedicate a daily time to read aloud to your child and let them read to you. Ask questions about the story, make connections to your family experiences, and exchange ideas. Let them try reading words on their own. Practice sight word books and decoding strategies to help students achieve fluency.</p>	<p>You are a Super Reader! Read books with your family and talk about the stories. Try reading unknown words on your own by using decoding strategies, write and draw about what you've read, and retell the story to a family member. Re-read to increase fluency and comprehension.</p>
