<p>Polite</p>	<p>Set reading and math goals with students and share with parents to support student success. Provide parents with activities and resources that focus on building decoding and comprehension skills, as well as reading and math fact fluency.</p>	<p>Know your child’s goals. Have fun with the reading activities and math resources. Use them to help your child practice adding and subtracting quickly and accurately, as well as reading fluently with understanding.</p> <p>Monitor progress by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Checking folder daily. -Talking with them about their day. -Celebrating with them when they show progress toward their goals. -Attending academic events at school and parent/teacher conferences. 	<p>Use the reading activities to become a smooth and accurate reader. Think about what you are reading to improve your comprehension skills. Use the math resources to become quick and accurate when adding and subtracting. Complete homework practice to help you reach your reading and math goals. Ask for help when you need it and don’t be afraid to try new things.</p>
<p>Responsible</p>	<p>Offer online support to parents of both in-person students and online students. Feature games, websites, and activities that can improve decoding skills, and solve addition and subtraction problems.</p>	<p>Use online learning tools and/or suggested research-based educational practices provided by the teacher to improve phonics, reading comprehension, and math fact fluency.</p>	<p>Be responsible and work hard when using online games to help you improve your speed and accuracy when reading text and solving addition and subtraction problems.</p>
<p>Obedient</p>	<p>Provide students with appropriate reading material through instructional resources, the media center, or online virtual libraries that they can take home to practice reading and building literacy skills.</p>	<p>Dedicate a daily time to read aloud to your child and let them read to you. Ask questions about the story, make connections to your family experiences, and exchange ideas. Give them time to decode unknown words and figure out its meaning by using context clues. Have them re-read to improve fluency and understanding.</p>	<p>You are a Super Reader! Read books with your family and talk about the stories. Re-read to increase fluency, practice decoding unknown words, write and draw about what you’ve read, and retell the story to a family member.</p>
