# Our Goals for Student Achievement

## LCBOE District Goals

In our efforts to increase **rigor** and student achievement, to provide **relevant** curriculum and learning experiences, and to build meaningful **relationships** with our students and stakeholders, the Laurens County School System has set the following goals for FY20:

- Increase the percentage of students reading on grade level based on CCRPI Lexile Levels by 3%.
- Increase number of students in ELA and Math scoring on the GMAS at a proficient or distinguished level by 3%.
- Increase the percentage of subgroup populations scoring at the proficient level on the GMAS by 3%.
- Increase or maintain school climate rating at each school by utilizing support resources and professional development as measured by the State Report Card and CCRPI Score.

## ELMS Goals

The administrators and teachers of East Laurens Middle School have studied student performance and other data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school. Our goals for FY20 are as follows:

**Goal #1:** During the FY 20 school year, ELMS will increase the number of proficient and distinguished learner in math on the GMAS by 5%.

- Focus area: Develop an Understanding of Statistical Thinking

**Goal #2:** During the Fy 20 school year, ELMS will increase the number of students reading within the Lexile grade band or above by 10% as determined by the GMAS.

- Focus areas: Vocabulary Development and Reading Endurance and Enjoyment

# 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Teachers, Parents, Students – Together for Success

## At School

The 7<sup>th</sup> grade teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our teachers' key connections with families will be:

- Our school web page has links to study guides for students and parents which are a helpful resource to build reading/vocabulary development and math skills/number system fluency. (Hard copies are available for parents who do not have internet access.)
- Offer Lunch and Learn for parents with focuses on Milestones preparation.
- Communicate regularly with the student and parents concerning students' progress in all areas specifically in reading (vocabulary development and reading endurance and enjoyment) and math (statistical thinking).
- Allow students to revisit, revise, and redo substandard work in a timely manner to increase vocabulary development and number system fluency skill acquisition.

## At Home

East Laurens Middle School believes that families are an important key in learning. ELMS parents joined with staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some family key connections will be:

- Improve vocabulary and reading endurance and enjoyment by **reading with your child at least 20 minutes per night.**
- Develop an understanding of statistical thinking by talking about averages and how number information is presented.
- Communicate regularly with my child's teachers concerning progress in reading (vocabulary development) and math (number system fluency).
- Check child's agenda weekly.
- Sign up for Remind.com and check it daily.
- Set aside time each night for study checking to see if any assignments need to be revisited, revised, or redone.

## Students

East Laurens Middle School students will work with both teachers and parents in order to be successful in reading and math. Here are a few ideas on how students can make connections between learning at home and school:

- Explore the links on our school web page for the study guides and complete the study guide with my family to increase my vocabulary and number system fluency.
- Talk with my family about the strategies discussed at our Lunch and Learn events like using statistics in real world events.
- Set aside time each day to read at least 20 minutes each day with someone at home.
- Maintain and organize my agenda and notebook in each class and be prepared by having my needed materials.
