

**What is Title I?**


Southwest Laurens Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with parents and family members, a written parent and family engagement policy.



**School Plan for Shared Student Achievement**

**What is it?**

This is a plan that describes how Southwest Laurens Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Southwest Laurens Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Southwest Laurens Elementary will support family engagement and how parents and family members can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



**How is it revised?**

Southwest Laurens Elementary welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent and family member feedback is used to revise the plan for the next year. The plan is written annually and posted on the school website for parents and family members to view and submit feedback throughout the year. We also distribute the annual survey online and provide written copies upon request to ask parents and family members for suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during our parent meetings to revise the plan for the upcoming year. Parent comments will be submitted to the district if the plan is found unsatisfactory.

**Who is it for?**

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Southwest Laurens Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, parents/family members with disabilities, and parents/family members of migratory children.

**Where is it available?**

At the beginning of the year, the plan is posted on our webpage, Facebook page, and sent home via Remind. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center located in the Southwest Laurens Elementary Media Center or on the school website.

### 2021-22 District Goals

In our efforts to increase rigor and student achievement, to provide relevant curriculum learning experiences, and to build meaningful relationships with our students and stakeholders, the Laurens County School System has set the following goals for FY22:

- 1-Increase percentage of students reading on grade level based on Reading Inventory Lexile levels from the 2021-2022 beginning of the school year data so that at least 75% of students are considered proficient at the end of the 2021-2022 school year.
- 2-During FY22, increase number of students scoring on the Math GMAS at a proficient or distinguished level to pre-COVID percentiles.
- 3-Increase FY22 percentage of all subgroup populations scoring at the proficient level on GMAS ELA and Math Assessments by 3% over FY21 scores.
- 4-Increase or maintain school climate ratings at each school by utilizing support resources available.


### 2020-21 School Goals

SWLE administrators and teachers have studied student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school.

Goal 1 - In FY22 SWLE will increase the overall percentage of proficient and advanced readers by 22% from the BOY to EOY based on Reading Inventory scores for 1st-5th grade students.

Goal 2 - In FY22 SWLE will decrease the percentage of students in the "support needed" category for BEACON math assessments to less than 25% for grades 3-5 by the spring of 2022.

Goal 3- SWLE will increase overall attendance in grades PK-5 by 0.5% to 95.6% in FY22.



## Southwest Laurens Elementary Parent Involvement Program and Activities

Southwest Laurens Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Meetings will be scheduled at various times and in different formats throughout the year. *Parents may request meetings at any time by contacting the school and speaking with the instructional coach.*

### Open House

### Annual Title I Meeting

We invite you to an evening of in-person and/or online learning and sharing about our Title I program including our parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, the school-parent compacts and the parents' requirements. Instructional staff will also describe and explain the assessments used to measure student progress and achievement levels.

### Parent Training Opportunities

We will provide periodic parent training designed to reinforce the learning focus outlined in the school-parent compacts. Parents will learn specific skills and tips on how to help their children in reading and math.

### Literacy Initiatives

Information, tips and links will be sent home periodically to help parents improve their child's literacy. In person meetings will be scheduled if possible.

### School Art Fair (In conjunction with Literacy Opportunities)

We invite you to have an opportunity to browse our School Art Fair to see your child's artwork created in class. Please join us as we celebrate the creativity of your child. This event may be virtual due to COVID.

Held on an individual basis to discuss student data and answer any questions regarding standards, assessments or achievement.

  - Communicate with parents of "Future Little Raiders" age birth-5 years old, and encourage developmentally appropriate activities and events at SWLE and in the community.




## Parent and Family Engagement Standards
