Owning My Behavior	Teachers will provide links to study resources for students and parents as a helpful tool to build reading/vocabulary development and math skills/fact fluency on our school web page, teachers' <i>Google Classroom</i> pages, and Remind.	Parents will check out the school web page to review the study resources with their child to build vocabulary and number system fluency.	Students will use the school web page, Google Classroom and/or Remind to try one new link or activity twice per month to help build their vocabulary, literacy, and math fluency.
Exercising Safe Behaviors	Teachers will communicate proper online protocol, focusing on internet piracy during research and writing assignments.	Parents will communicate to their child about internet safety and avoiding copyright piracy (not copying other authors' works.)	Students will make sure they are following their parents' and schools' guidelines for internet safety anytime they are online. They will avoid copyright piracy (copying other author's work) when completing writing assignments.
